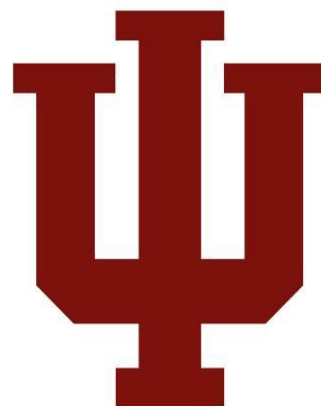

HEAD COACH: BEN REEL

Reel begins his first season at helm of Grenadier baseball program...



Ben Reel begins his first season as head coach for the IU Southeast baseball program. At the age of 25, Reel is one of the youngest head coaches in collegiate baseball.

During his time as an assistant coach, Reel served as hitting instructor, catching coach and recruiting coordinator.

Last spring, Reel guided eight different Grenadiers to all-conference honors offensively; led by Ben Wyatt who was an All-Region XII selection with a batting average of .408 and 61 RBIS – one RBI shy of tying the school record.

Also, two of Reel’s most productive hitters (Beau Manning and Mark Abell) signed independent professional baseball contracts after graduating from IU Southeast.

Defensively, Reel helped coach a Grenadier catcher to all-KIAC honors in each of his first two seasons as the catching instructor.

In 2006, Reel was the starting catcher and team captain for the IU Southeast baseball squad that finished 30-26 overall and as KIAC Runner-Up. On the field, he hit .347 with 37 RBIs and a team-leading 19 doubles en route to earning KIAC first team honors. His 19 doubles are third most all-time in a single season by a Grenadier player as well as the most by a catcher.

For his strong performance in the classroom, he received the KIAC Scholar Athlete Award and was named a NAIA All-American Scholar Athlete. While still competing on the field and completing his eligibility, Reel began serving as recruiting coordinator for the program through an internship opportunity.

In the summer of 2006, Reel spent time traveling Europe representing the United States of America playing for Team USA. Prior to his time at IU Southeast, Reel played for two seasons at Cleveland State (Tenn.) Community College under Coach Mike Policastro. In the spring of 2005, Reel posted 1.000 fielding percentage behind the plate for the Cougars.

Reel was a three-year starting catcher at South Dearborn High School, earning EIAC All-Conference First Team and All-Region Honors. He was also a member of the American Legion Region VII Championship team.

Reel, a graduate of South Dearborn High School, received his bachelor degree in general studies from IU Southeast in 2007 and currently resides in New Albany, Ind.

IU Southeast Baseball Season Preview

The 2009 season starts a new era of baseball at Indiana University Southeast. First-year head coach Benjamin Reel, a former Grenadier player and assistant takes over a team that won both the KIAC regular season and tournament championships last season. Twenty-six upperclassmen and a talented group of young players look to defend their place at the top of the conference while aiming to improve on last year's mark of 32-24 - three games shy of the school record for wins.



Another former Grenadier, hitting coach and recruiting coordinator, Joe Nattermann returns for his third season as an assistant at IU Southeast. New additions to the staff include pitching coach Matt Vincent (played three seasons in the St. Louis Cardinals organization), outfield coach Andrew Stanley (first-year coach and University of Southern Indiana graduate) and hitting coach Beau Manning (currently under professional contract with the Continental Baseball League).

Pitching Staff

The Grenadier pitching staff returns two first-team All-KIAC performers from 2008 - seniors Adam Lipke and Shane Zoeller. Lipke had a 7-4 record a season ago with a 4.39 ERA and 70 strikeouts. Zoeller finished with a 5-0 record and five saves out of the Grenadier bullpen. Fellow senior Billy Murphy, a transfer from South Suburban College, is healthy and ready to take the hill after an injury kept him sidelined for most of 2008.

Juniors Kris Eschman and Derek Decker received second-team All-KIAC honors last season and look to pick up where they left off a year ago. Eschman recorded a 6-2 record, 54 strikeouts and a team-low 2.92 ERA in 61 innings. Decker finished with a perfect 4-0 record, including a combined no-hitter with Zoeller, with a 3.98 ERA. He also received KIAC and NAIA Region XII Player of the Week honors. Three other juniors (Brent Bennett, Alex Brewer, and Brandon Clemmons) saw action on 2008's conference championship team and will be key contributors to the Grenadiers' rotation this spring. Junior Alex Sedam returns after receiving a medical redshirt in 2008. In limited time last season, Sedam's strikeout-to-walk ratio was 36-8 while facing three of the nation's top-25 teams (10th-ranked Tennessee Wesleyan College, 19th-ranked Union College and 22nd-ranked Southern Polytechnic State University).

Sophomore Adam Burton pitched in six games in 2008 and is expected to see more innings this season. Newcomers Cort Alsop (Rend Lake College) and Travis Sands (New Albany H.S.) will also see plenty of action in 2009.

Outfield

The outfield is a veteran group with four seniors back in 2009. Ben Wyatt (Cleveland State C.C.) earned All-Region XII and first-team KIAC honors a season ago with a team-high .408 batting average and 61 RBI – one RBI shy of tying the school record. Wyatt also recorded 69 hits, three homeruns and a .976 fielding percentage in 52 games last year. Jeremy Boehnlein and Ryan Jones return to play their fourth and final season in a Grenadier uniform. Boehnlein hit .256 with three homeruns and 18 RBI as a junior. Jones saw limited action in 2008 but batted .277 with 16 RBI in his sophomore season. Kevin Foley (Wabash Valley College) started 39 games in 2008 and batted .242 with 30 hits and 17 RBI. He also posted a .977 fielding percentage.

Other returning players include: junior Kyle Lenn (Vincennes University), who batted .273 with five RBI in six games last spring before suffering a season-ending shoulder injury, and redshirt freshman D.J. Hutcherson (Lawrenceburg, Ind.). Both are ready and expected to make an impact for the Grenadiers in 2009.

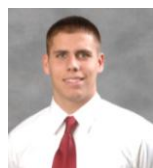

Infield

Senior Drew Locascio leads a solid group of middle infielders for the Grenadiers in 2009. He started 50 games at shortstop last season and batted .359 with two homeruns, 25 RBI and 34 runs scored. Locascio was named second-team All-KIAC last season. Juniors Derek Mills (North Vernon, Ind.) and Casey Crawley (Louisville, Ky.) are expected to contribute up the middle this season. Sophomore Jordan Pass (Marshall University) also returns from last season's squad and will see action in the spring. Newcomer Bryan Clemmons (Seneca H.S.) has the versatility to help the team at second base and on the mound in 2009.

Sophomore Daniel McDonald is the only returning first-baseman on the roster. McDonald batted .292 in 18 games as a true freshman. Also competing for time at first are newcomers Jeff Klump (Jr., Vincennes University) and Cory Woosley (Jr., Louisville Male H.S.). The group takes over for three-starter Mark Abell (Louisville, Ky.) after an impressive senior season. He was named second-team All-conference after batting .339 with 62 hits, seven homeruns and 32 RBI. Abell signed a professional contract with the Continental Baseball League this fall.

Junior Dustin Goodlett is the only third baseman that saw action last spring. Along with Goodlett, newcomers Josh Weinberg (Jr., College of the Desert, Palm Desert, Calif.), Craig Roberts (Fr., Owen Valley H.S.) and Travis Schroeder (Fr., Lawrence Central H.S.) look to replace the production of first-team All-KIAC honoree Beau Manning (Louisville, Ky). In his senior season, Manning batted .366 and led the Grenadiers in hits, runs scored, homeruns and stolen bases. Manning, a four-year starter, owns four career records at IU Southeast (Most games played - 211, Most At bats - 699, Most Runs Scored - 191, Most Hits - 248). Manning signed a professional contract with the Continental Baseball League this fall and will play in the Arizona Winter League beginning in January.

Catchers

Senior Randy Koch started 32 games behind the plate in 2008 and returns to man the position this season. Koch hit .267 with two homeruns, 15 RBI and recorded a .950 fielding percentage last year. He was named second-team All-KIAC. Newcomer Kirby Dunagan (Greensburg, Ind.) transfers to IU Southeast from the University of Southern Indiana. The junior batted .264 with 23 hits and 11 RBI and recorded a .981 fielding percentage in his last season as a Screaming Eagle. Dunagan will see action behind the plate and in the line-up for the Grenadiers in 2009. Baird Hall (Shelbyville, Ky.) and Van Fowler (Louisville, Ky.) return for their junior seasons. Hall was limited last season with a shoulder injury but will be ready to go in 2009. Fowler filled the designated hitter role and batted .276 with 21 hits and 12 RBI.

Schedule

The Grenadiers open the 2009 season in Jackson, Tenn. in a four-game set against Lambuth University. Before returning home to face Cardinal Stritch, IU Southeast heads to Williamsburg, Ky. to face the 10th-ranked team in the country, The University of the Cumberlands. The Patriots will then make the trip to New Albany later in the season (April 14). The Grenadiers begin KIAC-play March 20th at Berea College. The rest of the conference schedule includes a trip to Asbury College and two home sets against Brescia University and Alice Lloyd College. Other notable 2009 opponents are Georgetown College, Campbellsville University and Indiana Tech University.

IU Southeast Baseball Predicted KIAC Pre-Season No. 1 by League Coaches

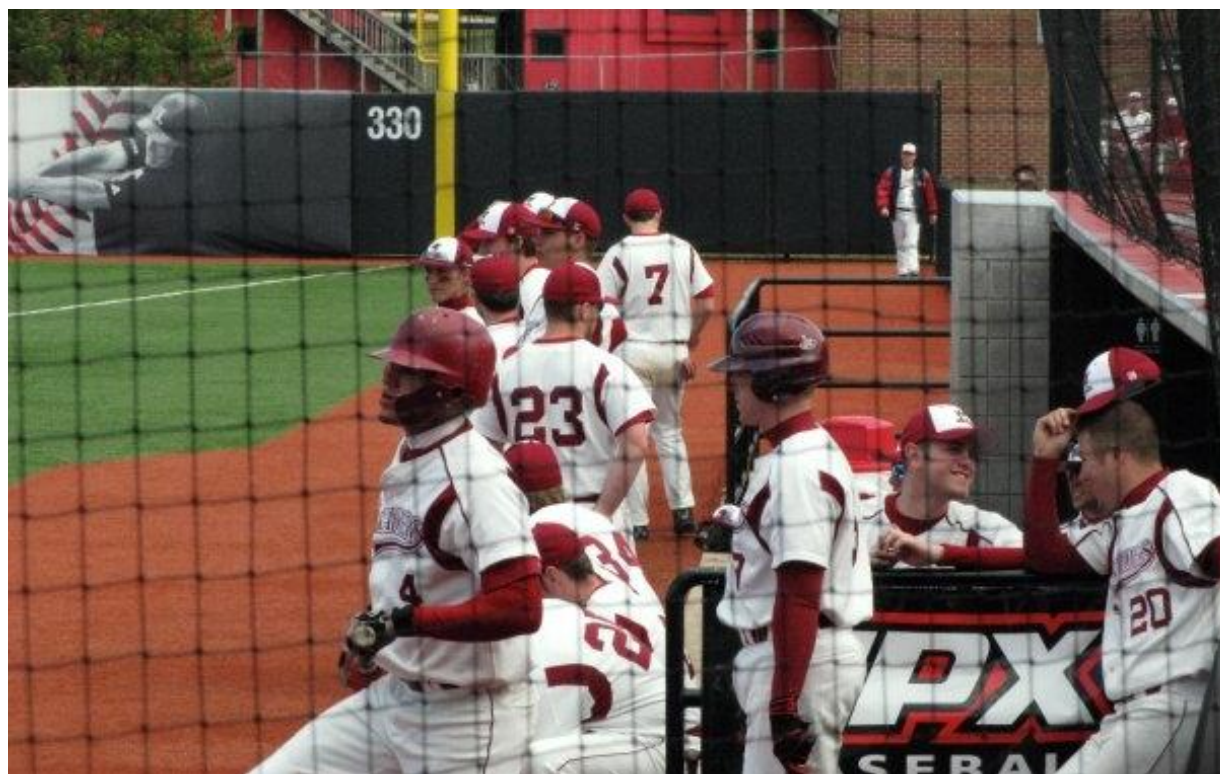
Indiana University Southeast was picked by Kentucky Intercollegiate Athletic Conference baseball coaches to win the conference's regular season title during pre-season voting. The Grenadiers won distinction with 23 points over Brescia University's 20 total points.

IU Southeast also received three of the five first place votes among coaches, while Brescia gained the other two. Asbury College finished with 13 points in the voting, while Berea gained 12 points. Alice Lloyd College is projected to open up in fifth place.

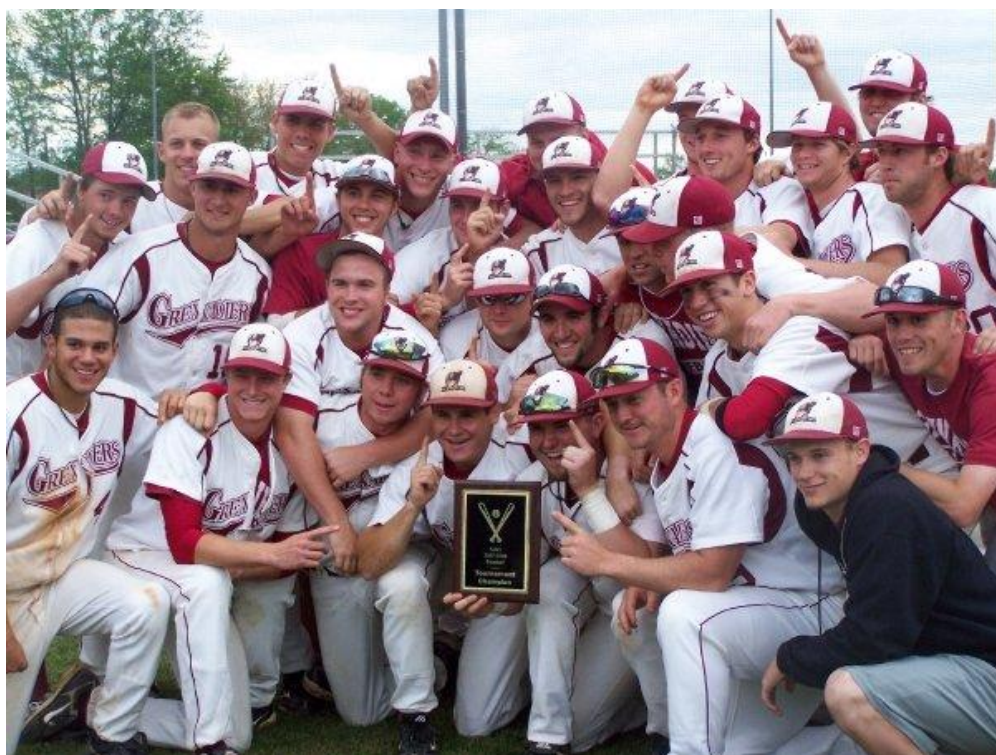

The Indiana University Southeast office of Sports Information provides complete information and media services regarding the institution's seven intercollegiate sports. The office is responsible for all public and media relations pertaining to athletics, athletic department publications, the athletic department's website, statistical and historical record keeping for all sports and other promotional activities surrounding the athletic department.

A complete description of the services provided by the IU Southeast office of Sports Information follows:

Media Services and Policies

Interviews - All interviews with IU Southeast coaches, student athletes and staff members must be arranged through the office of Sports Information. After games, matches and other athletic events, locker rooms are generally off limits to members of the media. Player and coach interviews, however, may be conducted outside locker room entrances or on the playing surface after a minimal, 10-minute cooling off period for participants.

Practices - Practices are generally closed to members of the media. However, special admittance may be granted with prior knowledge of intentions. Contact the Sports Information Specialist with inquires.

Game Day Coverage and Press Passes - Any media member covering a game, match or other contest hosted by IU Southeast is asked to reserve a press credential at least 24 hours prior to the event. While last minute media are welcome, prior knowledge of your arrival is much appreciated. For most sports, the office of Sports Information will provide statistical information and/or box scores as soon after each home match as possible.

Press Conferences - In the event of a press conference, the primary media covering IU Southeast Athletics will be notified as far in advance as possible. To be added to the primary media list, contact the office of Sports Information.

Game Programs, Game Notes and Media Information - Pre-game information may be obtained from the office of Sports Information when available. If notes, programs, etc., are not available, the office of Sports Information will assist members of the working media in any way possible to ensure accurate reporting.

Technology - At most IU Southeast events, a general phone line, fax line, and photocopier will be made available to members of the working media. IU Southeast also provides free wireless internet connections for all working media members. Please contact Sports Information Specialist Joe Glover for assistance with this feature. When those amenities are unavailable, the sports information office or appropriate other office will be made available before, during and after events.

Radio - Any visiting radio broadcasts must reserve their seating and phone lines at least two weeks in advance of the event to be covered. While late-comers are welcome, phone lines and seating can not be guaranteed. For basketball, and volleyball, one analog phone line will be reserved for visiting radio, whether previous arrangements have been made or not.

Photographers - Photographers are asked to stay in the respective end zones for basketball. For all other sports, standard shooting spots may be utilized. Similar policies apply for credentials and seating reservations.
