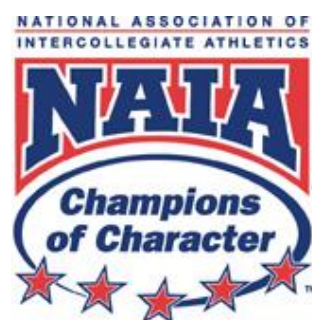
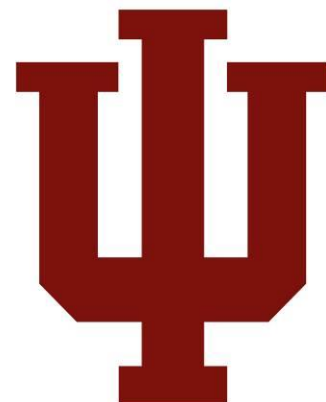

## Softball Head Coach: Todd Buckingham



Buckingham enters his third season as head coach for the Grenadiers after successfully leading last year's softball team to its first-ever NAIA National Softball Tournament in the program's second season of existence. In 2008, Buckingham also led the team to its second KIAC Tournament Championship and the program's first-ever NAIA Region XII Tournament Championship while posting a 33-15 overall record.

Buckingham came to IU Southeast from Bluefield State College, an NCAA Division II college in Bluefield, West Virginia. Buckingham coached for five seasons at Bluefield State and set the career record for softball coaching victories. He also led the program to its first winning record, and accrued the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WVIAC) Softball Coach of the Year Award in 2005. Prior to coaching at Bluefield State, Buckingham worked several camps and clinics, including at the Tri-State Softball Academy.

Buckingham received a bachelor's degree in biology education from Olivet Nazarene University in 1998 while playing baseball for the Tigers. He then moved back to Indiana, where he taught Science at South Central Junior/Senior High School in Elizabeth in 1998 and then taught Science & Math at St. Joseph School in Corydon from 1999 to 2001. While at South Central he coached boys' tennis and junior varsity boys' basketball. During his tenure at St. Joseph, Buckingham helped establish a drama department and a basketball program for 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders. Buckingham is a native of Corydon, Indiana, and a 1994 graduate of Corydon Central High School.

Buckingham enters his eighth overall season as a college softball coach, earning a career coaching record of 135-177. During his eight years of coach, Buckingham has coached 15 of his former and current player to all-conference status including Amanda Dispenett who was named 2007 KIAC Pitcher of the Year and NAIA Academic All-American.

Buckingham was also one of two coaches for a team of U.S. softball players who traveled to Spain in the summer of 2008 with USA Athletes International, Inc. (USAAI). Next summer, Coach Buckingham will continue his partnership with USAAI by coaching a U.S. team of college players in Australia. Coach Buckingham and his wife, Angie, reside in Jeffersonville. The couple has two Labrador Retrievers, Abe and Myles.

## Grenadier Softball Looks To Make Season Three The Best Yet

After a trip to the 2008 NAIA Softball National Championships and their second consecutive KIAC Tournament title, the 2009 Grenadier Softball team is set to take the field in what will certainly be a tremendous “Season Three” of the program existence at IU Southeast. The team will have to deal with the loss of five All-KIAC players, two of which were also named NAIA All-Region XII, but plan to counteract those losses with what third year Coach Buckingham calls, “one of the deepest recruiting classes in the country.” Pair that with some top-notch returners and the squad just may make a return trip to Decatur, Ala.

Like any championship team, the success of the Grenadiers will start on the mound. They return three pitchers from last year, and have added some great newcomers as well. The squad returns sophomore Whitney Zollman (Charlestown H.S.), who led the team in wins with a 12-5 record, while accruing an ERA of 4.04. Also back is junior Brooke Martin (Louisville Butler H.S.), who also was selected All-KIAC with a record of 6-3. Jennifer Bartley rounds out the returning pitchers. Last season Bartley (Sr., Lincoln Trail C.C.) went 5-2 in the closer role, totaling three saves, good for 13<sup>th</sup> in the country. This season, Buckingham expects Bartley to step up and challenge for the No. 1 starting spot, after really impressive workouts in the summer and fall.



The depth of the pitching staff does not stop there, as IU Southeast brought in four more new arms. They are comprised of three freshmen and a transfer. The transfer is junior C.J. Combs (Kalamazoo Valley C.C.). She was the ace for her previous school and is a great control pitcher. The three freshmen are led by Amy Blackstone, a 1<sup>st</sup> team All-Stater from Fort Wayne Snider High School. She will be an intimidating force on the mound for the Grenadiers. The other two newbies are Kelsey Everett, a drop ball pitcher from Fountain Central High School in Indiana, and Louisville product Kayla Duke (Male H.S.). According to Buckingham, Duke could become the best “junk pitcher” IU Southeast has had.



With seven pitchers, the Grenadiers had to increase their catching staff as well, and did so with some phenomenal freshmen. Heather Shepherd, Anne Fowler, and Kaity Barton (Milan H.S.) are three freshmen that Buckingham says could start for any team in the conference. Shepherd (Warsaw H.S.) looks to be the best defensive catching prospect, while Fowler (Seneca H.S.) might be one of the best freshman hitters on the team. They are joined by returning junior SaraRose Hornung, who has been a two-year starter for the Grenadier program. Last season, Hornung batted .325 with eight doubles.

Moving around the horn from first base to third base, the Grenadiers have a lot of experience back in the infield, with some great prospects added to the mix. At first base, Jen Bartley will take over as the No. 1 person when not pitching. Last season, Bartley made spot appearances at first base until KIAC All-Conference and All-Region XII first baseman Amber Chapman went down in the KIAC Tournament with a career ending leg injury. Bartley seized the opportunity, and belted a huge homerun off the centerfield scoreboard in the NAIA Region XII Championship to help catapult the Grenadier squad to Nationals. When Bartley is on the mound, look for sophomore Tara Denzik (Louisville Butler H.S.), who hit .288 with 6 doubles in 2008, and freshman Kelsey Everett to split time. Both are good targets at first base and

are “scary hitters” according to Buckingham. Fellow freshman Amy Blackstone will also see time at first base.

Second base will be manned by committee this season for the Grenadiers. In the mix for big playing time is freshman Ashley Saddler (Evansville Central H.S.) sophomore Amber Pedersen, who served as the team’s designated player last season, compiling a .427 batting average with 23 stolen bases, and junior Brooke Martin. “Pedey and Brooke will be facing a new challenge at second. Both are great fielders who are fearless, so I have the utmost confidence in them. Ashley will definitely get her chances, but she will have to adjust to the speed of the college game. I think the three of them will combine to do a great job,” said Coach Buckingham.

The shortstop position will be interesting this season. “This spot could be one of our team strengths...or it could come back to haunt us,” Buckingham commented. The reason for the uncertainty is the health of returner Shana Andres. Andres (Jr., NE Mississippi C.C. via Floyd Central H.S.) is considered by the coaching staff as “an All-World offensive talent.” Last season Andres led the NAIA in triples per game, and was selected All-Conference and All-Region. She finished the year with some jaw-dropping stats: .421 BA, 11 triples, eight doubles, 29 RBI’s, 27 stolen bases. Unfortunately for Andres and the entire Grenadier program, she suffered a severe knee injury this fall and now will not make it back until March. Even then, her status will be in question. So, Coach Buckingham must turn to an untested freshman that was recruited to be the future catcher of the program, Heather Shepherd. She luckily has had a lot of shortstop experience in travel ball, and has amazed the staff thus far with her range and cannon arm. If she falters, the Grenadiers are in trouble. If she excels, Buckingham said he will keep Shepherd there and possibly try Andres at second base when she returns.



The injury bug has bitten the third base position as well, but the cupboard is far from bare. Returning starter Jennifer Harriman (So., Whiteland Community H.S.) will redshirt after suffering a shoulder injury at the end of the summer. Brooke Martin will be first in line to man the spot. Buckingham thinks Martin could be the best defensive third base player in the KIAC, but with her also seeing time at second and on the mound, the Grenadiers will turn to freshman Rachel Ferguson (Southridge H.S.), whose deadly bat will be huge for the team.

The players that manned the outfield last season for IU Southeast were the strength of the team. With the loss of All-Conference and All-Region players Carmen Davis (.350, 11 doubles, 11 home runs, 32 RBI’s, nine SB) and Michelle Reyher (.366, 13 doubles, 30 RBI’s), one might think that fact will change. But, Coach Buckingham has recruited some phenomenal freshman to take their spots. What will help keep the team strength in the outfield will also be the return of senior Paige Dickey (Jeffersonville H.S.) and Amber Pedersen. Dickey (.436 BA, 7 doubles, 20 SB) was the starting right field last season, and looks to keep that spot while also seeing time at the other two outfield spots. Buckingham had this to say about Paige: “Dickey is a great leader and has really taken the freshmen under her wing. She has been our leading hitter the past two years and I expect nothing less from her this go ’round.” Coach Buckingham is very excited about Amber Pedersen as well. “Her speed and cannon arm are perfect fits for a centerfielder, which is where she will be if she is not at second”, said Buckingham.



The freshmen talents previously mentioned begin with Louisville product Allie Alford (Seneca H.S.). Alford has a great bat, lightning speed, and is fearless in the field. “I count my blessings daily that Alford

did not play big-time travel ball,” said Buckingham. “I really think she is a D1 talent,” he added. Another local outfielder, Danielle Endris (Bedford North Lawrence H.S.) also excites Buckingham.

“Endris is a raw talent that was also hidden from a lot of coaches’ radars. She is a one of those thoroughbred athletes that you find once every 10 years or so. She can flat out play,” Buckingham said.

Another freshman, Megan Sanders (Warsaw H.S.) figures to get a lot of playing time with her speed and small ball ability. The outfield dark horse is redshirt sophomore Michelle Houtsch (Pike Central H.S.). She has the hitting and fielding to be a big contributor, not to mention experience, entering her third year in the IU Southeast program. Others looking to make contributions in the outfield include Hornung, and Duke.

The 2009 IU Southeast Softball squad looks to be young this season, but a return trip to the NAIA National Tournament in Alabama is a real possibility. It will ultimately depend upon the development of their newcomers, and the leadership provided by the players that played in Decatur last season. Coach Buckingham ended with, “Last season our idea was to outscore our opponents with the long ball and extra base hits. This season, we will definitely switch gears and focus on our team speed and defense. Whatever success we have will come down to how well we play in the field. Defense wins championships. If we ever want to make a run at the National Championship, we have to be able to stop people. Is this that year... we’ll see...we just have to play every day like it is our last.”

The Indiana University Southeast office of Sports Information provides complete information and media services regarding the institution's seven intercollegiate sports. The office is responsible for all public and media relations pertaining to athletics, athletic department publications, the athletic department's website, statistical and historical record keeping for all sports and other promotional activities surrounding the athletic department.

A complete description of the services provided by the IU Southeast office of Sports Information follows:

### Media Services and Policies

**Interviews** - All interviews with IU Southeast coaches, student athletes and staff members must be arranged through the office of Sports Information. After games, matches and other athletic events, locker rooms are generally off limits to members of the media. Player and coach interviews, however, may be conducted outside locker room entrances or on the playing surface after a minimal, 10-minute cooling off period for participants.

**Practices** - Practices are generally closed to members of the media. However, special admittance may be granted with prior knowledge of intentions. Contact the Sports Information Specialist with inquires.

**Game Day Coverage and Press Passes** - Any media member covering a game, match or other contest hosted by IU Southeast is asked to reserve a press credential at least 24 hours prior to the event. While last minute media are welcome, prior knowledge of your arrival is much appreciated. For most sports, the office of Sports Information will provide statistical information and/or box scores as soon after each home match as possible.

**Press Conferences** - In the event of a press conference, the primary media covering IU Southeast Athletics will be notified as far in advance as possible. To be added to the primary media list, contact the office of Sports Information.

**Game Programs, Game Notes and Media Information** – Pre-game information may be obtained from the office of Sports Information when available. If notes, programs, etc., are not available, the office of Sports Information will assist members of the working media in any way possible to ensure accurate reporting.

**Technology** - At most IU Southeast events, a general phone line, fax line, and photocopier will be made available to members of the working media. IU Southeast also provides free wireless internet connections for all working media members. Please contact Sports Information Specialist Joe Glover for assistance with this feature. When those amenities are unavailable, the sports information office or appropriate other office will be made available before, during and after events.

**Radio** - Any visiting radio broadcasts must reserve their seating and phone lines at least two weeks in advance of the event to be covered. While late-comers are welcome, phone lines and seating can not be guaranteed. For basketball, and volleyball, one analog phone line will be reserved for visiting radio, whether previous arrangements have been made or not.

**Photographers** - Photographers are asked to stay in the respective end zones for basketball. For all other sports, standard shooting spots may be utilized. Similar policies apply for credentials and seating reservations.
